Kirk Overbey knows very little about theater but a lot about parliamentary procedure. He believes that most people who study procedure remain hindered in their ability to execute it, and this holds true for even registered parliamentarians.

Motions In Action is his response to overcoming this problem. Participants will follow a fictitious group, the ABC Parliamentarians Unit, through fifteen meetings in a realistic setting. The action is captured in sixteen easy-to-follow scripts. Sixty different motions are demonstrated—about four per script.

Kirk became a member of the NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF PARLIAMENTARIANS® in 1993. He became a Registered Parliamentarian in 1996, a Professional Registered Parliamentarian in 2005, and an NAP trainer in 2011. For several years, he led a twenty-week-long online seminar to prepare members for the RP exam.

Kirk is former president of the Texas State Association of Parliamentarians and the Austin Parliamentarians Unit. He was TSAP Parliamentarian of the Year in 2003.

Kirk has an active practice as a professional parliamentarian, serving some eighteen organizations. He is a frequent workshop presenter at NAP events.
